



The program was jumpstarted with support from the Atlanta Braves Foundation and the Awesome Foundation. Brookhaven Storage donates warehouse space for our book inventory.





State of the District Speech – Tucker HS. Cross Keys Foundation co-sponsored the Superintendent's State of the District Address. We supplied volunteers and Refreshments to encourage engagement.

Advocacy 2016

- Cross Keys Task Force (Latin American Association, Center for Pan Asian Community Services, Cross Keys Foundation) ensure accountability for the Fernbank ES, John Lewis ES, and CCHS redistricting moves.
- The Foundation served as chief advocate for the community in the DCSD Secondary Schools Study and resulting SPLOST V projects plan.
- CKF white paper recommendations to DSCD were well received and influenced much of the resulting plan.
- Effort resulted in earmarks of \$84M for a new HS and \$30M for two new ESes. Additional funds in the millions were allocated for urgent needs at Cary Reynolds and other area schools.
