





Foundation volunteers construct, decorate, install and stock a network of <u>Little Free Library</u>(TM) units in our service area to provide ubiquitous and year-round access to quality reading materials to our underserved population and to generate excitement about reading.

The program was jump started in 2012 with support from the Atlanta Braves Foundation and the Awesome Foundation. Brookhaven Storage donates warehouse space for our book inventory.
